CAMBRIDGE – If you are in the market for fresh local produce, meats, cheeses and prepared foods, then Cambridge has a venue for you.

In the coming week the city will soon have no fewer than three farmers' markets for shoppers to choice from. The largest and oldest is the Cambridge Farmers' Market, which has been in operation from the 1830s. It operates year-round on Saturday mornings at the corner of Ainslie and Dickson Street. This past week, it expanded operations for the summer months and is now also open on Wednesday mornings.

For shoppers in Preston, the farmers' market in Central Park has opened for another season. It runs Thursday afternoons, with roughly 12 vendors, through to early October.

On June 10, the new Hespeler Farmers' Market will be launched, involving 20 vendors. It will run through September from 3 p.m.
